

## **INFANT SECTION REVIEW OF THE YEAR 2018/19**

The Infant school strives to generate a warm and caring atmosphere in which all children can flourish and achieve their full potential. Foundations are firmly established, successful study strategies as well as a positive attitude to school are developed from Nursery to Year Two. Our ultimate aim is to give our young students the confidence and enthusiasm to become life-long learners.

In every year group students have sustained high academic standards as a result of the upgraded schemes of work followed in all areas of the curriculum. Indicators such as Reading Age are indicative of the accelerated progress made by our students.

Science and Topic based activities and extra- curricular activities enable students to develop their interests, talents and skills in an informal environment. Our four to seven year olds participated in a variety of after school clubs that cater to their interests. Computing, Scrabble, French, Music, Dance, Choir, Needle work, Art & Craft and Tennis are popular clubs.

The path to creating unity and diversity is paved by presenting assemblies that denote cultural and religious festivals of all nationalities. Students from all communities happily participated in the Christmas, Deepavali, Haji, Independence Day and Sinhala and Tamil New Year assemblies. These were enriching experiences for our students.

This year has been a remarkably successful year with events and achievements. In September C.I.S. celebrated its 36<sup>th</sup> Birthday. A variety of games and food stalls were organized to provide an enjoyable afternoon for our students.

In October our students participated in Library Week activities, assemblies and competitions aimed at developing and improving children's literacy, role play and reading skills. Every child and class received a certificate for their participation and achievement at a colourful presentation assembly in the school's auditorium.

Sport plays an integral part in a child's education as it fosters team spirit and friendship. Our enthusiastic students made impressive achievements in the field of sports this year. In October our Annual Sports Day saw our students, staff and parents display enthusiasm and fill the MCA grounds with colour and activity. The opening ceremony was a colourful drill display by the Year Two students. Every year group participated in their class relays and track events. Every child received a gift and certificate for their participation.

Our Infant Swimming squad every Wednesday and Athletic squad every Thursday have helped to improve swimming and athletic standards as well as enthusiasm for the sport. Congratulations to all our achievers.

In December students enjoyed celebrating Christmas doing lots of craft work as well as making very creative displays that adorned the Infant school.

The Christmas Carol Service was held in December at the Cathedral of Christ the Living Saviour. At this special event the Infant Choir performed with the Junior and Secondary Choirs harmonizing together in one voice. On the final day of the term all year groups enjoyed their class parties as well as a visit from Santa with a gift for every child.

Our Infant Choir is growing in popularity and consists of over 50 students from different nationalities harmonizing together and participating in special assemblies and events throughout the year. Every performance is highly commendable. Congratulations to all the students and staff involved in the Choir.

Term two was eventful with students excelling academically and socially.

Topic theme days were well planned and prepared. Students were involved in project work as well as interesting activities, learning cross curricular links between Science, Geography and Literacy. Every year group benefitted from their participation in topic oriented activities.

The highlights of the term were the Infant Art & Craft & Computer Art Exhibition titled "Fusion of Colour". Our young students worked with a range of medium and materials. They were encouraged to use their creative talents and skills. The outstanding computer generated art work was created using Microsoft paint application. The Art & Craft Exhibition was a splendid display of talent.

Performing Arts, Music and Dance are an important part of the extra-curricular programme in school. They provide students the opportunity to develop and enhance their skills and talents as well as their self-confidence.
