The past year has been a most successful and productive period in which happy children have made great progress in a wide range of academic and extracurricular activities. Many children joined the school this year and they have all had a very successful year.

Our Infant swimming squad has helped to improve swimming standards as well as enthusiasm for the sport. Congratulations to all our successful achievers in athletics and swimming this year.

In December Infant and Junior sections presented a special Christmas assembly on the 4th of December at the auditorium. Our Christmas Carol Service was held on the 9th of December 2015, with many children participating in the Carol service held at the Cathedral of Christ the Living Saviour. This was a special event where the Infant choir performed collectively along with the Junior and Secondary schools, harmonizing together in one voice. We are indeed proud of our music teachers for this achievement. On the final day of the term all age groups enjoyed their class parties as well as a visit from Santa with a gift for every child.

Term two was quite bright and eventful with pupils excelling in their academic progress. Class assemblies have been of a very high standard developing self-confidence and public speaking skills.

In February children presented a beautiful assembly along with the Junior School to mark Sri Lanka's 68th Independence Day on the 4th of February.

Topic theme days were very special to every year group. Children were actively involved in their respective topic days with interesting educational topic based activities.

The Infant Art & Craft & Computer Art exhibition titled “Hands @ Work” displayed students creativity, skills and talents working with a range of medium and materials. Computer generated art work was created by using Microsoft paint application. The exhibition was a spectacle of colour.

Performing arts, Drama, Dance and Music are a valuable part of the extra curricular programme in the school. They provide students the opportunity to develop and enhance their skills in acting, dancing and singing as well as their self confidence. The highlights of the 3rd term were the Infant production ‘The WABAC’, and Variety concert ‘Pirates Vs Mermaids’ and ‘The Hungry Caterpillar’. The Wabac musical production is an original stage adaptation of the popular children’s animated movie Peabody and Sherman edited to suit our young performers. A cast of over 200 performers back tracked all the way to the Trojan war, ancient Egypt, the Renaissance and the French Revolution to bring alive this musical adaptation.

Our youngest pupils from the Pre Reception and Reception took the audience on an adventure across the seven seas as they battled it off in a delightful musical “Pirates vs. Mermaids”. A musical treasure chest by Gaynot Boddy and Rebecca Kincaid. Our little friends from Nursery ‘C’ presented a colourful presentation of the popular story by Eri Carl ‘The Very Hungry Caterpillar’. The collective effort and contribution by the entire cast and our dedicated teachers contributed to the great success of the productions.
