In October students participated in book week activities, assemblies and competitions which were aimed at developing and improving children's literacy, role play and reading skills. Every child and class received a certificate for their achievements and participation in all activities.

Sports play an important role in our curriculum. In October our Annual Sports day saw pupils, staff and parents fill the MCA grounds with colour and activity. Many excelled in their track events and class relays. Our Year One's and Two's who participated in the Junior Swimming Squad and Athletic squads have helped to improve swimming and athletic standards as well as enthusiasm for the sport. Congratulations to all our achievers! In December children enjoyed celebrating Christmas with lots of hands on activities and displays around the school.

Our Christmas Carol Service was held in December at the Cathedral of the Living Savior. At this special event the Infant choir performed collectively with the Junior and Secondary choirs harmonizing together in one voice. On the final day of the term all age groups enjoyed their class parties as well as a visit from Santa with a gift for every child.

Term two was eventful with students excelling academically and sociall y. Class assemblies have been of a very high standard developing self- confidence and public speaking skills.

Topic is an enjoying and enlightening subject which pupils follow with much interest and enthusiasm learning cross curricular links between Science, Geography and Literacy. Topic theme days were special to every year group. Pupils were actively involved in interesting activities during their well-planned topic days.
