Year 6

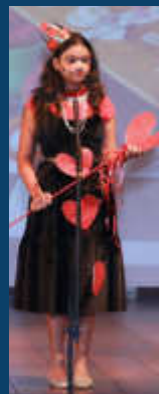
The year sixes celebrated Library Week on the 23rd of January, leaving behind many enchanting moments and a trail of magic.
