All our Year 4 students celebrated the ancient Maya on the 28th of October.

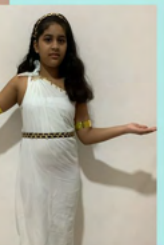
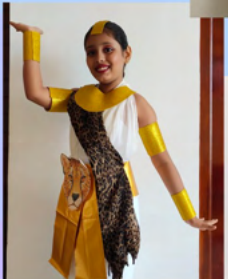
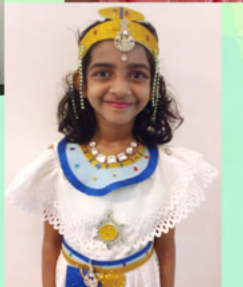
We had a wonderful session full of exciting activities. We sang, we danced, made a Mayan headdress and enjoyed a delicious Mayan Meal.
