We have also made a nomination for the much-coveted Lester B. Pearson scholarship at Toronto University for the forthcoming academic year.



We were absolutely thrilled to hear that one of our esteemed alumni, Raveen Kariyawasam (2017 batch), has been awarded the Rhodes Scholarship. This highly competitive award is given only to the most exceptional post-graduate students internationally, allowing them to study at the Oxford University in the UK. We know Raveen will make the most of this fantastic opportunity and

we are eagerly awaiting him returning to Sri Lanka to tell us all about his experiences, after he has completed his studies there.

At CIS, we are very proud of how we have collectively adapted to a dual approach to learning and we intend to retain many aspects of our online learning programme when we return to classroom based education. Our Google Classrooms allow students a direct point of contact with subject and pastoral staff and include a record of the lessons taught and resources shared throughout the year – definitely an invaluable revision resource that we will continue to maintain! A lot of work is currently also underway updating our much loved Electronic Research Library (ERL), which has an impressive new look;



improved usability and a whole range of updated resources.
