Our current Year 13 students are now assiduously preparing for the next stage of their education, working with our experienced team of University Coordinators who are guiding them through the application process. The specialised coordinators for each region (UK / Australia, New Zealand and Malaysia / USA and Canada / Global), give students the targeted support and advice they need. In addition, students also benefit from a selection of Enrichment courses focused on this next stage, including workshops on writing personal statements and interview coaching.

Years 11, 12 and 13 were also inspired following a visit from past student and newly awarded Rhodes Scholar, Raveen Kariyawasam. Raveen is the first Sri Lankan in 54 years to secure a Rhodes Scholarship to study at the University of Oxford and he spoke inspiringly to our students about his journey to reach this pinnacle of academic achievement, giving them meaningful advice that we know they will take very seriously.





Although we are only in the second month of the academic year, there have already been a significant number of very enjoyable extra-curricular activities held. On 16<sup>th</sup> September, the Prefect's Guild hosted a movie night on the school premises. For Years 7-11 this was a screening of 'Croods: A New Age' in the auditorium, while Years 12 and 13 enjoyed 'Uncharted' on the basketball court. Both movies were accompanied with a delicious range of snacks which seemed

to create even more excitement than the films themselves!

On 1<sup>st</sup> October, we were also able to once again hold the school's much-loved annual Road Race.
