At IGCSE, 66% of grades were 8 or 9; our AS students achieved 60% A grades and at A2, an incredible 75.7% of grades were A\* or A. We are really proud of all our students, who worked so hard to succeed despite the most challenging of circumstances.

As we are sitting still in front of Zoom for much of the day currently, the Sports department are eager to get us moving and have set up a number of Google Classrooms targeted at different sports, with
